## A NEW UNION

The move to join with ATL in the formation of a new Union to be known as the **National Education Union (NEU)** has taken a further step forward.

On Saturday 5th November, NUT held its one day **national conference** at Hamilton House. The National Executives motion in support of the new formation was put to the conference and after debate was **passed by a large majority**. Manchester representatives who attended report a good debate. The significance for NUT and for ATL of this proposal is huge and there is, and will continue to be, much to consider by the membership. Already concerns are being expressed about proposed restrictions on the participation of retired members in the conduct of Associations. For some small NUT Associations this would make them not viable. A fundamental problem for many members is that **qualified teacher status** will no longer be the sole criterion for membership. For those members who hold this as their reason for joining NUT there is **much soul searching to do**.

Positive points are that both NUT and ATL have declared that a **qualified teacher for every child** will be **fundamental policy** for the new Union. In addition a very strong selling point is that the new Union will be **the largest education Union** by far and will be a

strong force in driving forward the best for children in our schools.

National Executive is now considering the next step in the process which will be to put the proposal agreed at the Special Conference to a **ballot of the whole membership**.

All members should look out for the ballot, study the issues in depth and be sure to **cast their vote**. **Yes, cast your vote!** This is not a decision to be avoided.

## PRIMARY ASSESSMENT CAMPAIGN

The NUT campaign for an independent review of Primary Assessment is proceeding. Secretary of State, Justine Greening, has already agreed to halt proposals to make Year 7 re-sits mandatory and to halt development of 'further tests'.

NUT is seeking to go further in reforming primary assessment and is supported in this by **ATL and NAHT**. The Union knows the importance of moving forward along with its sister Unions but is fully aware of the need to act soon especially if there is to be any boycott of tests. DfE has said it will carry out a **'consultation'** in January.

Meanwhile NUT is supporting the **'More Than a Score'** coalition with parents, academies and the Cambridge Primary Review Trust and others. Write to your MP with your views on Primary Assessment and support your Union's call for independent review.

school and learn the budget cuts that it faces, should funding plans remain as they are.



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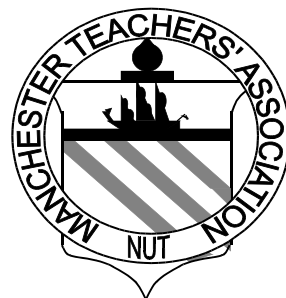
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## MTA GENERAL MEETING
